

Wood Finishes	<p>Our finish material is a crystal clear, urethane acrylic blend. This type of finish should only be repaired in the field by a qualified refinisher. Contact Nucraft Customer Service for detailed touch-up and refinishing instructions. Nucraft recommends using a damp cloth to clean your fine wood furniture. Always wipe with the grain of the wood.</p> <p>Should your wood furniture require a more thorough cleaning, we recommend using a mild cleaner such as dish soap or oil soap, thoroughly diluted in water (one part soap to thirty parts water). Water will not damage Nucraft’s finish, but will leave surface spots when it dries. To avoid this, dry the surface with a soft cloth after it is cleaned. Marks that cannot be removed with the cleaning methods above may be able to be removed using a mild degreasing solvent.</p> <p>Wood will fade with exposure to UV light. Items left on wood surfaces with UV light exposure over time will cause marking and outlines on wood—such as books, papers, blotters, stickers, etc. (Similar to a rug on a wood floor.)</p>
Laminate & Novawrap	<p>Laminate and Novawrap surfaces may be cleaned with a damp cloth and ordinary soap or non-abrasive household liquid detergent. Dry the surface with a clean cloth or soft paper towel to prevent streaks from appearing.</p>
Metal	<p>Metal surfaces can be wiped with a damp cloth and rubbed dry. A mild non-abrasive household liquid detergent can be used if necessary. Regular maintenance of metal components, including tightening of fasteners and light lubrication of moving parts, will extend the life of your furniture.</p>
Painted Surfaces	<p>If a spill occurs, clean up with a clean damp cloth or sponge, and dry the surface thoroughly with a soft cloth. A spill left unattended could soak through the surface and cause damage. To remove food residue or grease, use a small amount of mild dishwashing liquid and a clean damp cloth to wipe clean. Dry thoroughly with a soft cloth.</p>
Glass	<p>Clear back painted or satin glass may be cleaned with commercial glass cleaner. Be sure to use a lint-free cloth if cleaning the satin side of the glass.</p>
Acrylic	<p>Acrylic sheeting can be damaged by harsh solvents and cleaners. Use a commercial plastic cleaner or mild soap and water to remove dirt and debris. When applying cleaner, use a non-abrasive lint-free or microfiber cloth that won’t scratch the surface.</p>
Quartz	<p>For everyday cleaning, simply wipe the Quartz surface with a soft cloth, soap and water. An ordinary soap or non-abrasive household liquid detergent is acceptable. After cleaning, wipe the surface completely dry to avoid streaks. Spills should be wiped up immediately.</p>
Marble	<p>Marble is porous and stains easily. Wipe off anything spilled on marble immediately. Occasionally wash marble surfaces with lukewarm water and wipe dry with a clean cloth. To avoid leaving streaks, wipe surface with a damp chamois cloth. Should your marble surfaces require a more thorough cleaning, wash with a mild household liquid detergent solution, rinse and wipe dry.</p>
Granite	<p>Granite surfaces may be cleaned with a damp cloth and ordinary soap or non-abrasive household liquid detergent. Dry the surface with a clean cloth or soft paper towel to prevent streaks from appearing.</p>
Solid Surface	<p>For day to day cleaning, warm soapy water or non-abrasive household cleaners such as glass cleaner or commercially available solid surface cleaners will remove most residues. Then rinse and towel dry the surface to prevent spotting especially in areas with hard water.</p>
Linoleum	<p>Wipe clean with a damp cloth and a neutral cleaner. In order to maintain the surface of Furniture Linoleum a blend of water and natural soap or waxes should be used periodically. If the surface has been neglected or worn hard, a dilution of water and natural soap or waxes can be used to upgrade the Furniture Linoleum. Do not use alkaline or alcohol based cleaning products since it will damage the surface.</p>
Fabric	<p><b>Knoll Felt and Knoll Hopsack</b> Cleaning Code: S-Solvent based cleaning agent   To clean felt fabric use a solvent based cleaning agent to remove any stains. <a href="#">More detailed cleaning info here.</a></p> <p><b>Hourglass</b> Cleaning Code: WS-Water or Solvent based cleaning agent   To clean Hourglass fabric use water or a solvent based cleaning agent to remove any stains. <a href="#">More detailed cleaning info here.</a></p> <p><b>Leather</b> Genuine leather requires very little care. Nucraft recommends that leather be dusted regularly. If a more thorough cleaning is needed, use lukewarm water and a mild, nonabrasive soap. Generate some lather and lightly rub the surface with cheesecloth. Rinse off any soap film with clean water and towel dry. The leather may dry dull. To restore the leather to a normal gloss, rub it with a clean towel. Never use furniture polish, oil, varnish or ammonia. Saddle soap may be used to prevent the leather from becoming brittle or cracked and to maintain the original supple finish.</p> <p><b>Polyurethane</b> Clean with soap and water. Thoroughly rinse all solution residue with clean water.</p>
